BoW360

Next year will be the 360th Anniversary of the Battle of Worcester. To encourage people of all ages, backgrounds and historical know-how to get involved in commemorating the Battle of Worcester's 360th Anniversary, the society has developed the initiative of BoW360. We want to encourage individuals and organisations to become a part of the commemorations by registering their events online. This will then form a programme of events all relating to the Battle of Worcester or the Civil War. Registering an event is free and we have the fantastic support of the Worcester News, which will be publicising these events. All we are asking of people is that they use the BoW360 logo. We think the best way to really make an impact with this initiative is to make it as wonderfully innovative as possible. We've already had ideas such as 17th Century

Bell ringing classes at the Cathedral, Children's Opera at the Three Choirs Festival, craft days and 17th Century cooking classes... all of these go a long way to ensure that no-one is left out of the commemorations. We also would like to be able to sponsor a Sealed Knot reenactment on the Anniversary of the Battle in 2011. This is going to require some intensive fundraising over the next few months, so if there if there are any events or activities that you think will help raise money for BoW360 we'd love to hear from you.

Civil War Live

Tuesday 31st August -Sunday 5th September 2010

The week started with setting up the BoWS display in the great hall. The week went well with a great deal of interest from the public in both the display, reproduction artifacts and the Ken Potts' maquettes. Due to this we gained at least 3 new payed up members and had many other members of the public taking away membership forms.

On Friday the bulk of the re-enactors arrived late afternoon to start setting up the soldier's camp in the garden along with the Living History display in The Commandery itself. There was a good turnout at the reception prior to the Drumhead Ceremony, made up of BoWS Members and re-enactors. The evening was perfect with the sun slowly going down and the bells from the Cathedral sounding. Everyone formed up, and with colours flying and drums beating we marched up onto Fort Royal. Once in place on Fort Royal we started with a musket volley. As the Rev. Paul Tounge started the service the bells stopped (divine intervention!) after which we had another volley followed by a minute's silence that was then broken by a third volley from the muskets. We were treated to a short address from Councillor Andy Roberts after which we formed up and marched back down to The

Commandery: The march and service lasted just less than an hour with over 100 people in attendance.

Saturday and Sunday saw the re-enactors in action in The Commandery with around 500 visitors this turned out to be a huge success. There were drills in the garden including two musket firings per day as well as pike drill. Younger visitors also got to have a go at some pike drill. There was a magnificent display in the Great Hall and in various rooms we had more displays and cameos including a tavern scene, craft room scene and a general with maps planning for the forth coming battle. In the resource room was a 17th Century printing press producing pamphlets for Charles calling for citizens of Worcester to rally to the cause at The Commandery and join the

About 30 re-enactors attended over the weekend. These were made up of members from the Sealed Knot, English Civil War Society and Worcester Reenactors, some traveling as far as Plymouth and London and all of them volunteers.

Special thanks should go to Brian himself. Without his organisation and liasing with The Commandery, the Civil War Live week would not have gone a head. Many thanks Brian!
